

Digital Heritage: Anticipating an Integrated Way Forward Edinburgh Group Workshop Report COTAC: January 2020





Building upon the EU Fostering cooperation in the European Union on Skills, Training and Knowledge Transfer in Cultural Heritage Professions: Open Method of Coordination (OMC) Report launched in June 2019, the COTAC enabled Edinburgh Group arranged and held a related Workshop at the Engine Shed, Stirling on 7 November 2019 hosted by Historic Environment Scotland (HES). Developing and expanding upon the presentation themes, the Workshop Report was launched in January 2020.

The *Open Method of Coordination* (OMC) 22 EU countries strong Group worked over two years to produce this comprehensive report. It contains recommendations on the four developmental phases of heritage professionals: raising awareness; education and training; lifelong learning, and knowledge transfer.

Following EU project scene setting, the Edinburgh Group *Digital Heritage: Anticipating an Integrated Way Forward Workshop* addressed current technological developments, related skills and training initiatives and evolving learning resources emanating from the HES Engine Shed innovative Educational Programme.
